Every year, the Louisville Zoo honors the incredible work of our dedicated volunteers and we award those volunteers who deserve special acknowledgement.


Diane Taylor Spirit Award

Jelani, Back on Exhibit!

he Louisville Zoo cares for and is dedicated to maintaining the wellness and well-being of over 1,100 special animal ambassadors. On August 13 of this year, Jelani started to present symptoms of lethargy, decreased eating habits and weakness when climbing, his keeper care team responded quickly!


It isn't uncommon for gorillas to have heart or dental diseases, but during Jelani's initial examination both issues were ruled out. Instead, an abdominal mass was discovered. ACT scan suggested that Jelani had a perforated intestine and localized infection — another condition that has been reported in gorillas in managed care. It can happen in humans as well.

Primate and human anatomy are very similar. Our Animal Health Care team lead by Senior Veterinarian Zoli Gyimesi, DVM and Associate Veterinarian Erica Lipanovich. **DVM** conferred with Baptist **Health Louisville General Surgeon** Richard Pokorny, MD to perform the surgery to remove Jelani's abdominal mass. Upon removal, they found that the mass was actually attached to the appendix.

The discovery meant the abdominal surgery would now become an appendectomy. This meant a less intrusive procedure and an easier recovery for Jelani. Luckily for our famous friend, gorillas, like humans, are able to live without an appendix and do not need to change their lifestyle, diet or activity level.

The surgery was a success and Jelani healed well! You can now see your favorite superstar gorilla eating, moving around, and visiting with his best friend, Bengati, on rotation in the Gorilla Forest sanctuary. Don't forget the Zoo is open year-round except on Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. We hope you'll come see him soon.

Tribute to Helen

aying goodbye to one of our animal ambassadors is never easy, and it was with heavy hearts we announced the passing of female western lowland gorilla Helen on October 14, 2022.

Affectionately called the "Grand Dame" of the gorilla world, Helen was much celebrated at 64 years old as the world's second-oldest gorilla in managed care. When Helen entered our care, she was already older than most! She became a resident of the Louisville Zoo's Gorilla Forest back in 2002 and inspired us every day since with her big personality and longevity. The typical median life expectancy for female gorillas in managed environments is about 39 years.

Besides the Zoo's staff that cared for her daily, she had her own dentist, cardiologist, gynecologist, neurologist, and orthopedist/pain manager. Helen taught us much about gorillas and geriatric gorilla care.

Helen was one of our most beloved ambassadors. Her fascination with human babies delighted families for decades. Mother to three, grandmother to 17, great-grandmother to 21, great-great-grandmother to 8 and great-great-grandmother to 1. She was a legend. The "Grand Dame" of the gorilla world lives on in all our hearts.



Fixer UPPER Project!

The giraffe yard is undergoing a little bit of a fixer upper! One goal of this project is to install new enrichment "swing-arms." This new feature will allow keepers to load the arms with food, treats and enriching toys which can then be deployed for the enjoyment of our giraffes. Along with our inner yard project, there is work being done to update the exhibit perimeter fence as well as the giraffe feeding area. Guests can look forward to the return of giraffe feedings in Spring of 2023! Construction is moving along smoothly and is anticipated to finish by the end of the year. Until the project is completed, you can visit giraffes Baridi and Kianga inside the temperature-controlled Giraffe House!
